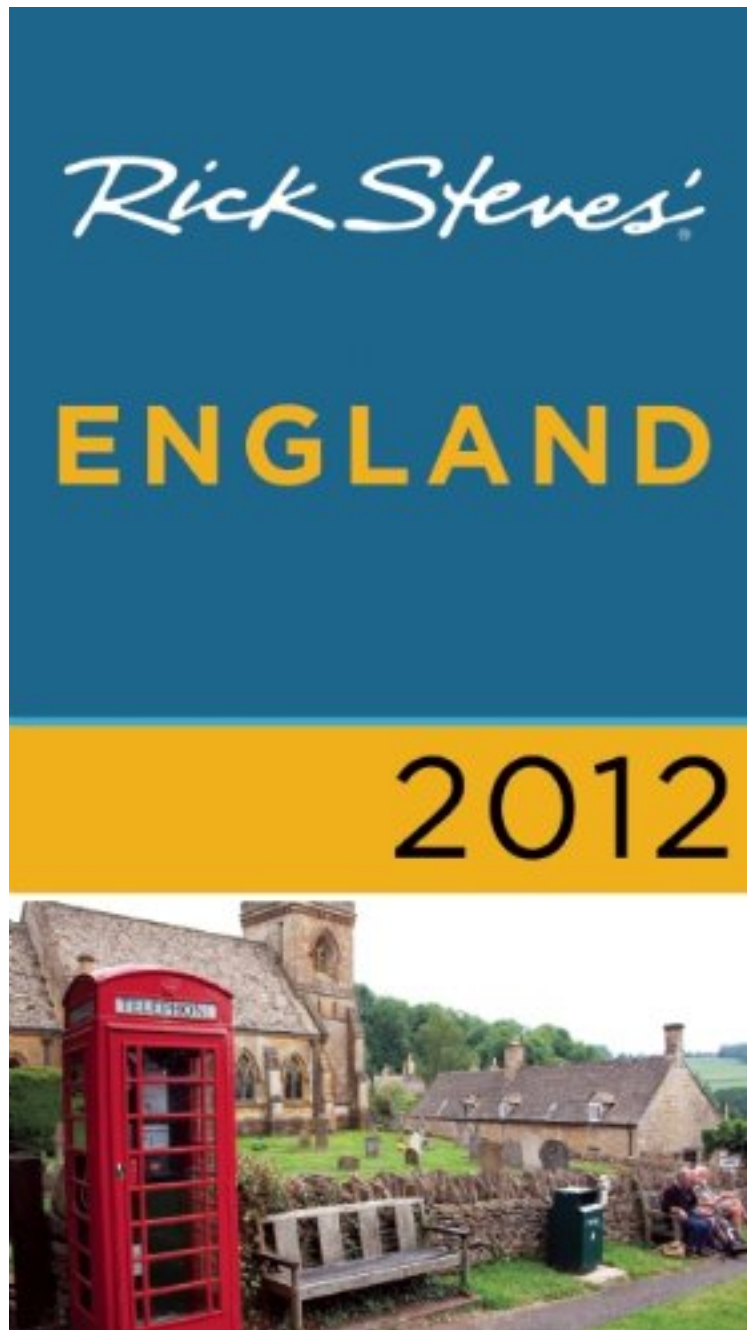

By cag2012 I'm usually a fan of Rick Steves' guidebooks, but this one was disappointing. It skipped huge sections of England, including most of the southwest coast, which is where I was planning to focus my journey. There was no Lyme Regis or even Plymouth, much less the smaller towns along the coast or places like Chesil Beach. This book attempts to guide you to where it wants you to go, not providing guidebook information on wherever you might want to go. Destinations the book does guide you on are well-covered, but if you're really looking for a true "back door" experience to get off the beaten tourist path, you have to go to those places that aren't the most common tourist destinations. It's also incredibly redundant. There's a quick hits section for most major areas that simply sums up what's come before it, but the entries before it were succinct enough that it just reads as filler. Were that stuff in there, perhaps there would have been room for the stuff I wanted to read about -- I've never noticed Rick Steves books being shorter than Frommer's, but Frommer's has both Lyme Regis and Plymouth. And the editor really needed to sit down and read the Kindle format edition. It's terribly out of order, and more and more travelers are going to be using eBook editions to save on carrying a bunch of books.
