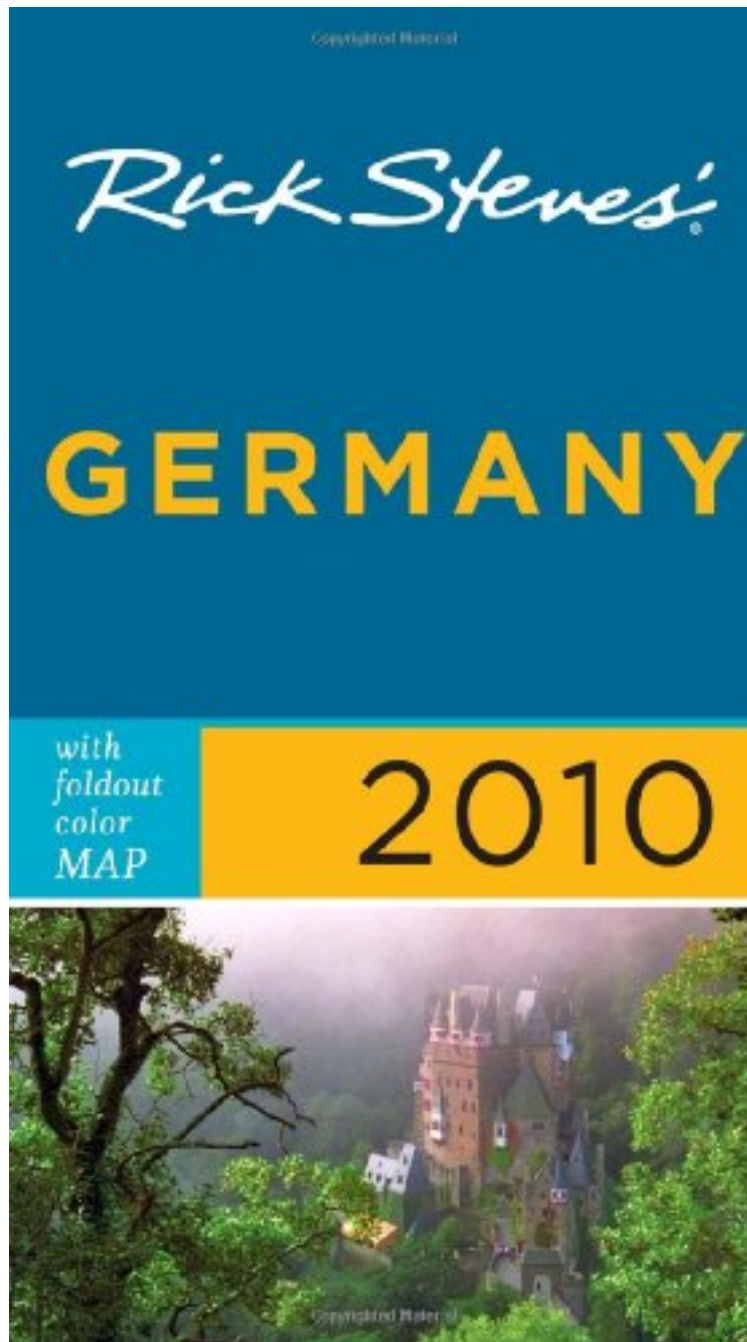

We'd been promising to visit them for 18 years and decided we should make the trip. We started trying to work with a travel agency but they wanted to push package trips. I had specific places I wanted to go that did not fit their canned trips. Two different agencies just left us hanging. So, I bought this book, read it, and then started sending emails to various places that Rick Steves had reviewed and recommended. Every place I contacted except one got back to me in less than 24 hours with the requested information. I made all of my reservations via email and our trip went just as planned. Note that Rick Steves is not a 5-star hotel kind of guy. He recommends small, relatively inexpensive places -- often Mom and Pop operations -- that really give the feel of being in Germany. They all came with breakfasts, some of which were so hardy that we skipped lunch. That's just what we wanted. However, these small places are generally not air conditioned and usually do not have elevators. If you want fancy, skip this book. If you want to experience Europe, give it a try.
