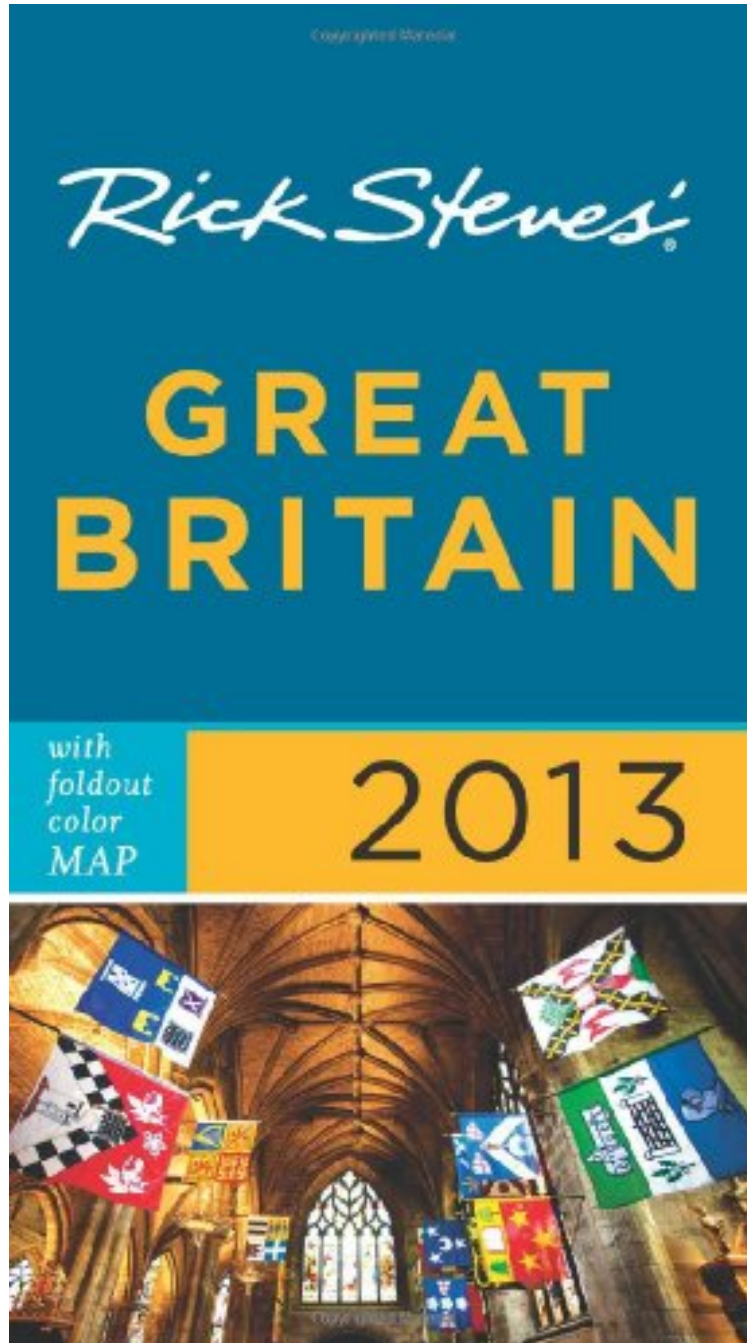

I am planning on backpacking through Europe for 3 months next Summer and I had heard many good reviews about Rick Steves. This book has everything! Most of the sites he mentions are laid out with the best time to see them, cost and hours, websites, and the best tube station to get you there. Everything is logical with either 0-3 triangles next to the name depending on how good the site is.He includes maps of many areas, they are okay (not very detailed), although I was impressed that this book included a giant colored map of London, the U.K, and tube stations (with helpful keys).This book includes things you might not realize you need to know until it's too late, like reading bus stop signs, weather, holidays,using the telephone to call internationally, renting cars, and how to beat the lines by buying certain tickets online. There are also lots of money saving tips for the frugal person. He includes a fun dictionary of "Britishisms" that will make you laugh. There are suggestions throughout on restaurants to visit, and places to stay. Something else I have heard (but not tried yet) is that Rick Steves has tons of free audio tours on his website, and they are very good.Suggestion: If you are thinking about buying Rick Steve's book on London, don't bother, just about everything you will find in there is in this book.
