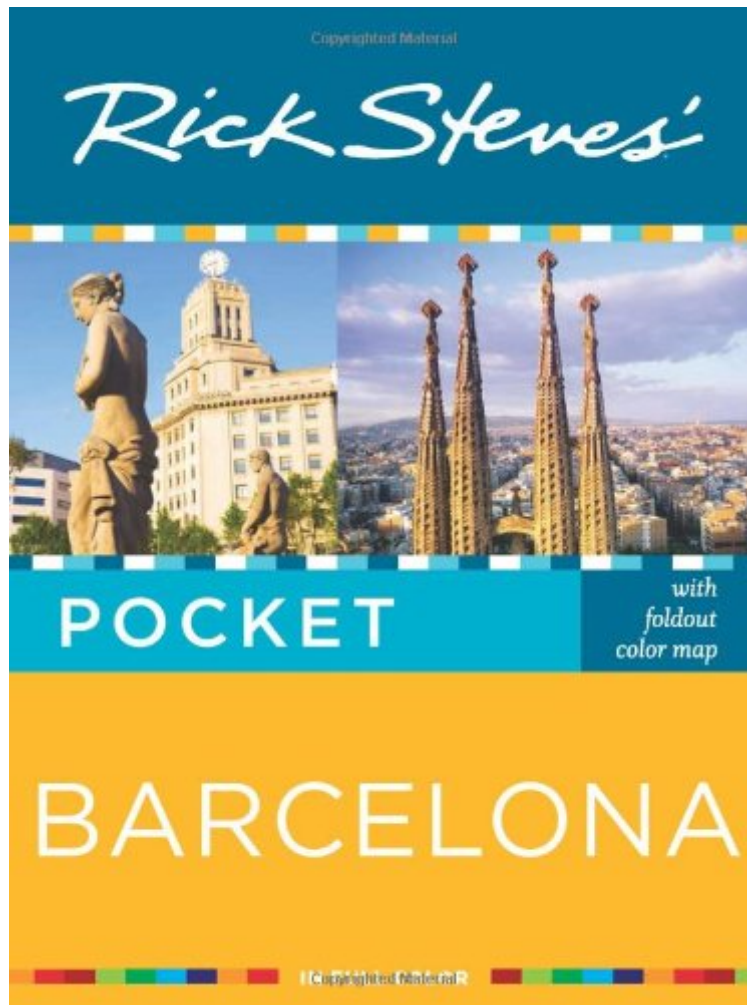

I was able to keep it in my purse, and refer to it as I was out and about. The different walks in the city were well laid out and I enjoyed using the book to help me explore. The only failure, was that even though this was the 2013 version, the entrance fees were already out of date. Also be aware that Rick recommends getting the BCN card, which no longer includes the Casa Mila. So the only advantage to getting the BCN card is direct admission to the Picasso Museum. Also I would recommend booking the online or ATM ticket for the Sagrada Família for 9AM, there is a little bit of a line still to get in, but it moves fast, and once inside you have few fellow tourists for the 1st hour. Also, since this is just a pocket guide, it falls short on the day trips, so read the big

Very quick and easy read, gives succinct highlights of each sight. Read it a few times in preparation of my trip, and I was able to provide some insight to my friends about the places we visited. If you're traveling alone, I suggest reading this before your trip and exploring the city. If you're traveling in a group, I suggest still getting a guided tour because relaying the information isn't as fun as reading it. But reading this before the trip will make you more knowledgeable about the different neighborhoods and areas to visit. There are maps provided in the guide of each neighborhood. Sometimes it was hard to read because the maps extend into the center of book and it was hard to differentiate streets when the lines start to run into the spine. Kept this book in my purse because it was so small. Was able to take it out from the time to time to verify information or to look for close recommended restaurants.
