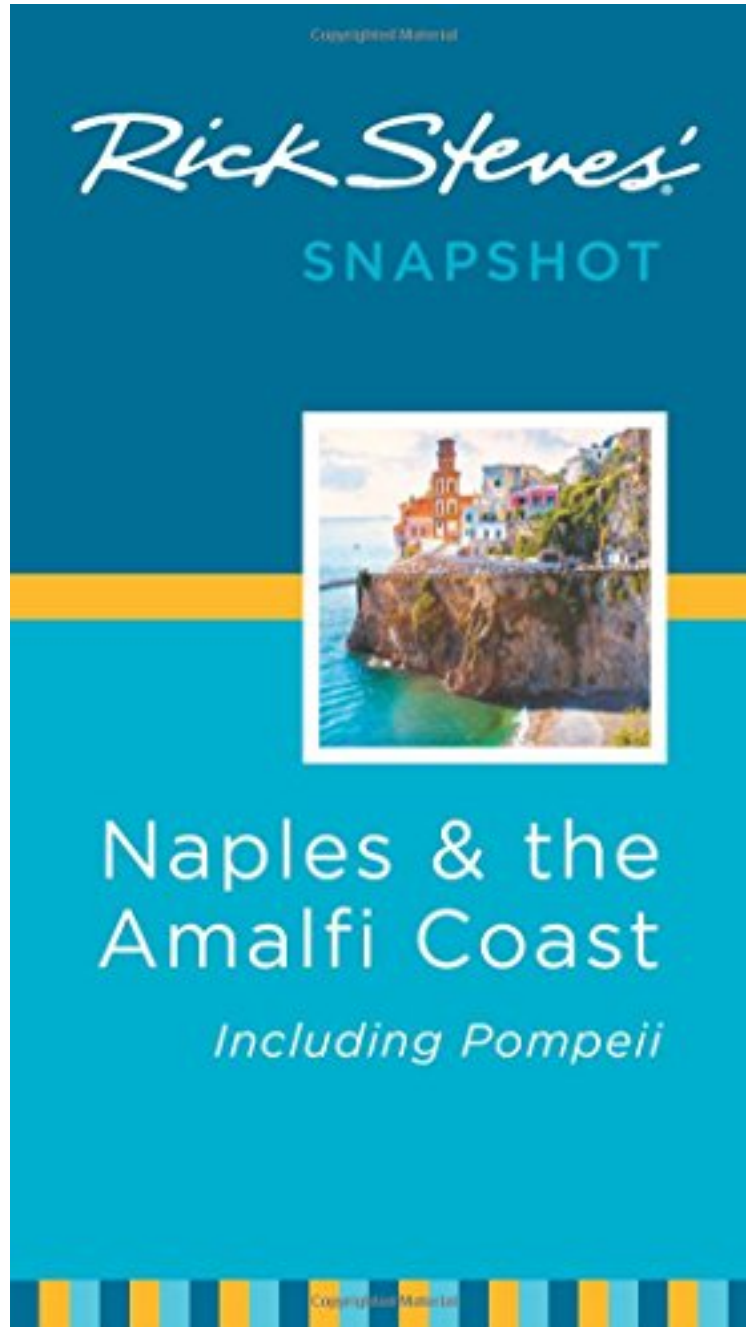

Anticipating what awaits makes traveling comfortable and Rick Steves' is excellent at that. We used this on a visit to the Amalfi Coast (Positano) for six nights and Naples for five nights. He seems a little negative on Naples and Positano and very high on Sorrento. We visited Sorrento for a day and would take our two locations way over that. We used his book often because of the content and small size (which we could easily put in a day bag). Much of the Pompeii Herculean info is outdated, but those historic locations change frequently on what is open and what is not due to continued excavations. Get the audio guides there.
