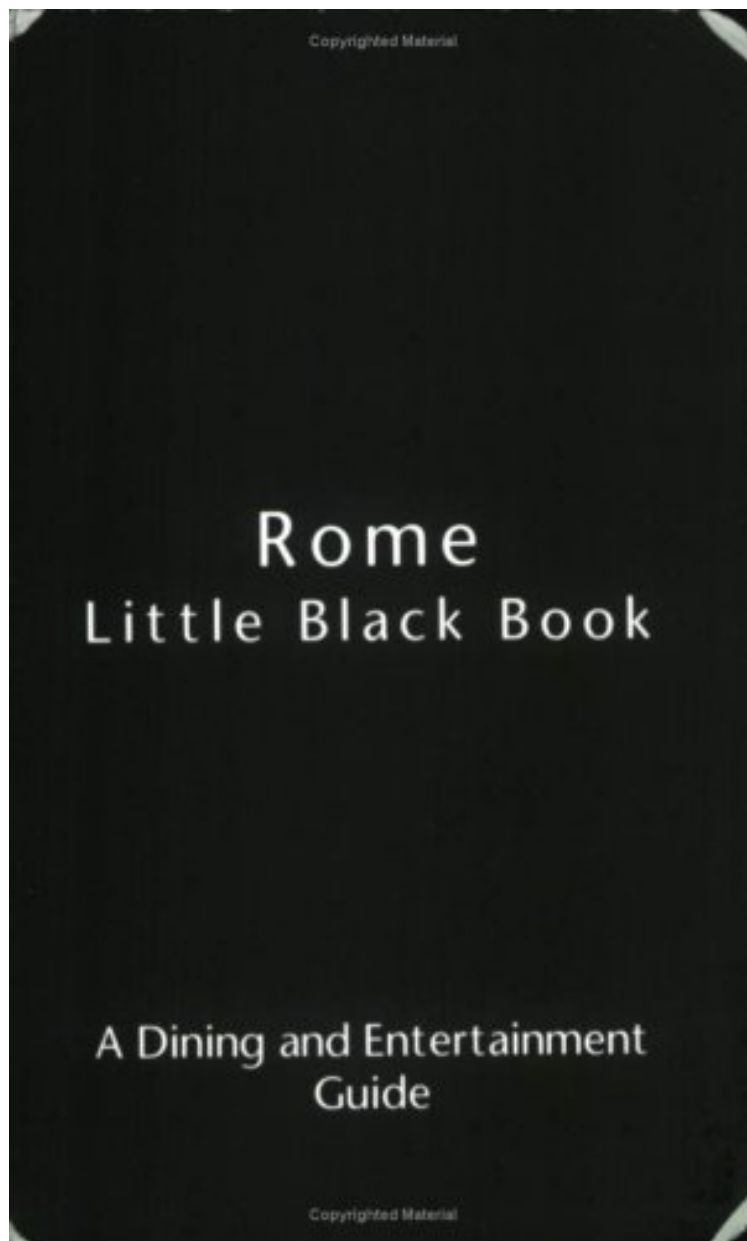

PIAZZA DI SPAGNA Piazza di Spagna has been Rome's traditional meeting point since the Renaissance when it was the main hang-out for artists and writers. The name comes from the Spanish Embassy, in residence in the piazza since the 1600s. The Spanish Steps, beautiful stairs leading up to the Church Trinita del Monti, are the hub of all activity. Throughout the day, visitors and locals walk casually around the piazza, browsing stores like Prada, Gucci, Louis Vuitton and Italian favorite Patrizia Pepe. Piazza di Spagna may be very hectic during the shopping hours but it is one of the more calm piazzas in the early mornings and evenings. CAFES **Antico Caffè Greco via dei Condotti 86 06 6791700 Grand cafe in the heart of Piazza di Spagna. Velvet chairs, paintings and sketches from the 18th and 19th centuries take you back in time to the old grandeur of Rome for a tranquil afternoon sipping granita di caffè con panna (frozen, crushed espresso with freshly whipped cream). **Casina Valadier Pincio Hill 06 679668 Take a walk in Villa Borghese, the lovely, well-kept park above Piazza del Popolo, and enjoy a café on the outdoor terrace at Casina Valadier, a refined café that also has a light lunch menu. **La Buvette Tea Room via Vittoria 44, 47 06 6793261 Posh tearoom that whisks you away from the shopping frenzy of Piazza di Spagna. La Buvette's pastries and beverages are perfect for an excellent afternoon tea. *Museo Atelier Canova Tadolini via del Babuino 150a,b 06 32110702 19th century artists' studio decorated with plaster and marble models of Antonio Canova's sculpture, early 19th century. Ground level is an old fashioned café, with a charming restaurant on the second level.
