It's written by a professor (Geology I think) and reads more like a college text book. Very indepth look at the different types of courses and how they came to be developed - from an environmental standpoint. The author is not trying to tell you about great courses to go play, but rather about the underlying rock and soil conditions; dune creations; affects of the receding glaciers, etc....I've read through many (40+) books about golf in Scotland and the history of the people, courses and equipment. Many of the history books are repetitive - interesting, but repetitive.
