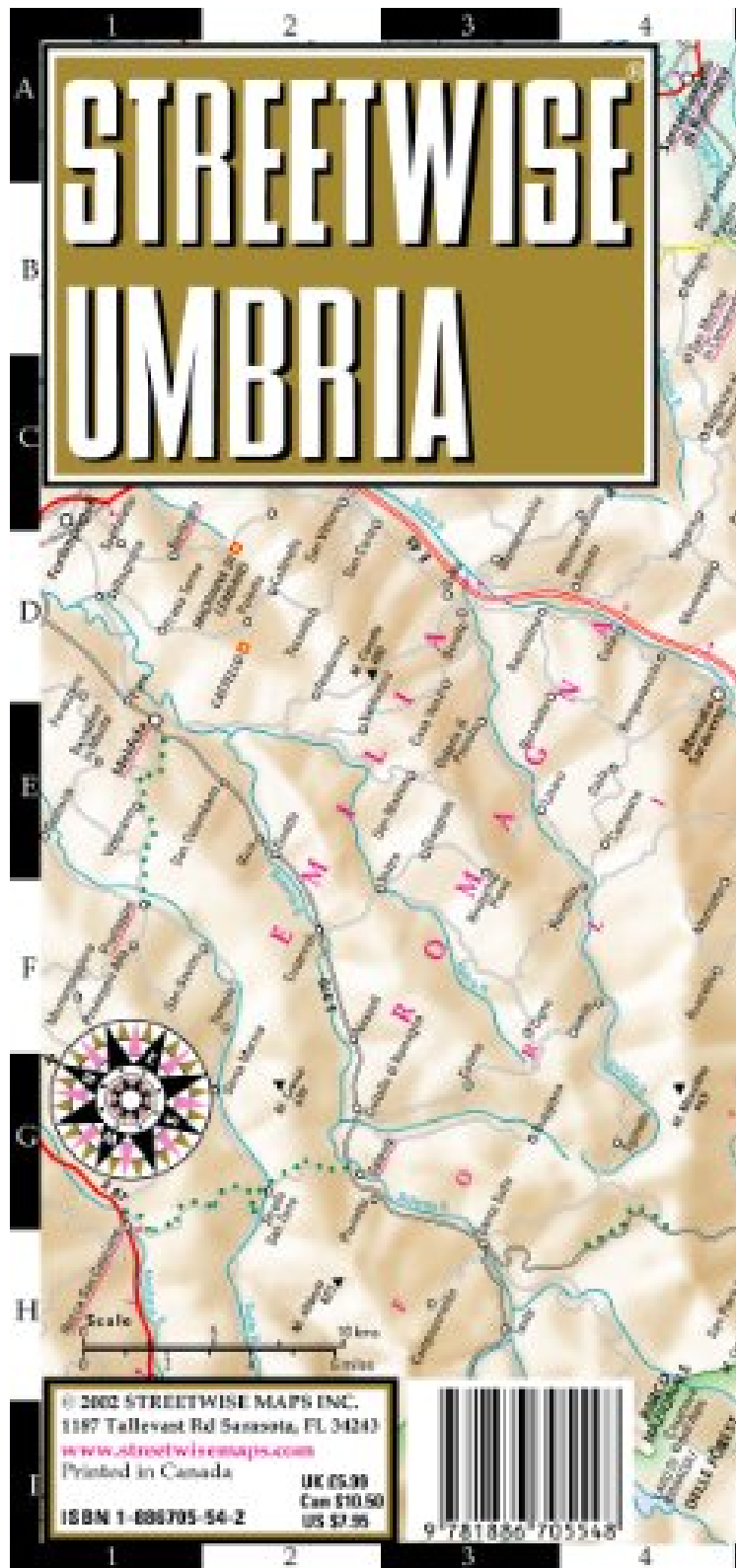

By Alice in Yankeeland This map of Umbria will be pretty worthless if you are planning a driving trip there. it is divided right down the middle of Umbria on two sides so you keep having to flip it back and forth to get a sense of the geography - and many of the lovely smaller roads are omitted. Get a detailed map from the Touring Club or Michelin instead. it also lacks detail insets for the key towns you will want to visit. bought this and found it so useless, we left it behind.

Main Umbria Map 1:280,000 Umbria is the lesser known sister of Tuscany. Where as Tuscany is famous, golden and glorious, Umbria is the quieter beauty, and therein lies its appeal, all of the charm without the crowds. You may already know some of the highlights of this region called the green heart of Italy: Assisi, home of the Basilica of St. Francis; Perugia, a university town founded by the Etruscans; and Spoleto, the venue of a renowned arts festival. Todi, Spello and Paganico are perfectly placed and offer comfortable places to stay and good restaurants both absolute necessities after a long day seeing the sights. Speaking of restaurants, Umbria is a foodie's delight. Chocolate is revered, as it should be, and Perugia even holds a chocolate festival each October called Eurochocolate. Orvieto is one of the most famous wines of the region, as well as a beautiful place to spend the day, and there are many others to taste and take home, provided you've left room in your suitcase. Deruta is known for its pottery and you'll want to slip a plate or two in your suitcase as well. A combination of dining and pottery can be found in the Buon Ricordo restaurants. Buon Ricordo is an association of restaurants that uphold the legacy of regional cooking. Each restaurant features a special dish that is prepared in accordance with local tradition. If you order the designated entrée from the menu, you can ask for the Buon Ricordo plate. The plate is a hand painted ceramic plate that is designed for the restaurant. The plates have become collector's items and some people plan their entire vacations around the accumulation of these keepsakes. His goal was to give someone the ability to navigate easily in unfamiliar terrain. He started with a new map format: the accordion fold. Such a simple idea, but at the time it was revolutionary. No more struggling to fold an awkward, oversized paper map. This new format would enable the user to blend in like a native, instead of stick out like a tourist. Brown then added lamination to ensure that the map would be a lasting tool. More important than the format was the design of the map itself. It had to be a map that not only succeeded above and beyond any map he had used, but was esthetically appealing as well. The look of it had to be as striking as the functionality. Color was introduced in a way that was never seen before in a map - vivid purple for water, soothing gray for the background of street grids, gold to highlight elements of the map. Clarity, conciseness and convenience in a very stylish package. Building the business was a 24 hour job. Brown sold the maps during the day, zipping around Manhattan making deliveries on his Harley Davidson. At night he packed the orders and did the design work. More titles were added, each title requiring months of research and design. Today, STREETWISE® produces over 130 titles for major destinations, regions and countries throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, Australia, Europe, the United Kingdom and Asia. We have grown from the back of a motorcycle to selling millions of maps around the world. Yet each title is still painstakingly researched and updated.
